Breathing Space Scheme

For professionals only

The Debt Respite Scheme (Breathing Space Moratorium and Mental Health Crisis Moratorium) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020 enable eligible individuals who are experiencing mental distress to have a breathing space.

A breathing space affords protections which include:

- pausing enforcement action and contact from creditors
- freezing interest and charges on debts whilst the mental health crisis lasts plus thirty days after the crisis has ended

To be eligible for a breathing space an approved mental health professional (AMHP) needs to provide evidence to a debt advisor that the individual is in receipt of mental health crisis treatment for a mental disorder which is of a serious nature.

An individual may be eligible for a mental health crisis breathing space if they meet one of the three criteria:

- has been detained in hospital for assessment or treatment (including under part 3 of the Mental Health Act 1983)
- has been removed to a place of safety by a police constable; or
- is receiving any other crisis, emergency or acute care or treatment in hospital or in the community from a specialist mental health service in relation to a mental disorder of a serious nature. This can include services offered

Who can make a referral?

- the individual receiving mental health crisis treatment
- the individual's carer
- approved mental health professionals
- care co-ordinators appointed for the individual
- mental health nurses
- social workers
- independent mental health advocates or mental capacity advocates appointed for the debtor
- a debtor's representative
