As I write this, after many days of indifferent not to mention inclement June weather, the sun has suddenly appeared as if from nowhere and it is positively warm! This will make a pleasant change for me when sitting at the entrance to the Farmers Market.

The market is still going strong after more than 20 years, but we do have fewer stalls than in those far-off halcyon days. Looking at the archives recently, (we've been doing some much-needed weeding and filing), it is clear that we must have had at least double the number of This however is stalls than we do now. representative of all markets across Kent, as the economy has suffered and people are looking at cheaper options than artisan/locally produced We have lost our weekly fruit and vegetable stall recently, as he couldn't sustain his losses, although he will be coming back to us on the first Tuesday of every month, so please make a note of that. We do have the French cheese stall still coming to us on that day and have egg, honey, jams, meat, home-made cakes, pies and bread stalls every week, together with our craft stalls. We also have the occasional guest stall such as plants, 'wood' stall and cut flowers. But the Farmers Market also acts as a community get together with people meeting up for coffee, not to mention the voluntary post office and the Parish Council Surgery once a month and plays an important role in village life.

We hope to have the dishwasher installed very soon. A dishwasher has been ordered and we have someone to install it. Making room for it has taken up the space of a two-door cabinet, but it will be great to be able to get things quickly washed up, particularly for events such as private hires, the community lunches and the Garage Safari.

It doesn't seem possible that the Garage Safari will be less than two months away by the time you read this. Now is the time to start clearing out those cupboards and attics to see if you have anything to recycle! This year the Safari is on the 1st September. We will have our normal refreshments at the hall, but will announce final details in next month's Grapevine. We hope that the good weather holds until after the Safari. Is two months' worth of good weather too much to ask do you think?

From the vicarage

An election campaign is underway – you've probably noticed – and perhaps, like me, you have been watching the televised debates between the leaders of the political parties, each trying to persuade us that theirs is the best suited to form a government to serve the nation over the next few years. And while TV debates might seem to have been with us for ever, the first was broadcast as recently as 2010.

Turn the clock back even further, and we find that general elections were once very different. When elections were called public meetings would be held in each town – hustings at which candidates would give speeches. These could be quite rowdy affairs, often attended by large crowds - but not everyone could vote. The rules around who could, varied from one place to another. Women were excluded. Voting was by a show of hands - there was no secret ballot before 1872 – so the possibility of intimidation, especially if your employer was a candidate, was very real.

Back to 2024 and thinking of our upcoming election, here's a quotation from John Wesley - travelling preacher, founder of the Methodist Church and, in his time, something of a celebrity. With the general election of October 1774 approaching, he spoke at a church meeting near Bristol. He later wrote in his Journal:

I met those of our society who had votes in the ensuing election, and advised them (1) to vote, without fee or reward, for the person they judged most worthy; (2) to speak no evil of the person they voted against; and (3) to take care their spirits were not sharpened against those that voted on the other side.

Things have changed a lot since 1774. But such wisdom is timeless, and worth remembering. Brian





Bonfires

Bonfires are often used to get rid of garden waste. This can lead to smoke and fumes which may cause problems for those living and/or working close by. Smoke can interfere with a neighbour's enjoyment of their garden, put them off opening windows and hanging out washing.

Section 79 of the Environmental Protection Act 1990 refers to nuisances caused by smoke.

It may well be that smoky bonfires could be a contravention of the Act if they occur on a regular basis, and prosecution could be considered.

Some considerations when having a bonfire.

- weather conditions
- time of day
- are neighbours likely to be in garden or have windows open?
- are neighbours drying washing outside?

There are some exemptions but, in general, commercial businesses, including builders, are not permitted to burn waste and are expected to adhere to strict government legislation regarding waste disposal.

If you are bothered by smoke from a bonfire, firstly approach your neighbour and explain the problem. If this fails the Environmental Protection Team,

Dover District Council, may be of help.

Dover District and Dartford Borough Councils working together have been awarded funding to support local residents improve the energy efficiency of their homes.

The money will be invested in homes across the district as part of the Home Upgrade Grant (HUG), funding the likes of loft insulation, cavity wall insulation, internal wall insulation for solid wall homes, air source heat pumps (ASHP) and Solar PV.

To qualify for funding the property and the occupants need to meet the criteria below: -

- The property is **NOT** heated by gas.
- The property has an EPC rating below a C. You can find out more about energy ratings https://www.gov.uk/find-energy-certificate (if you do not have an energy rating for your property you may still be eligible)
- The total annual household income (gross) is £36,000 or lower, or the occupants are in receipt of a means tested benefit.

The initiative is aimed at private homeowners in the district that meet the criteria and landlords with less than four properties (Landlord agreement required as contribution towards the cost of measures will be required).

- ▲ We have received numerous reports of courier fraud impersonating the Police in Dartford, Faversham, Birchington, Chatham and Rochester with losses at £21,000
- X All reports state residents receive a call from the Police and they either need to give their address for a courier to come and get their bank card or money. The scam can change from having a family member arrested and you need to call 999 or that fraud has taken place on your account.
- They may change tactics and ask you to transfer money to a 'safe account'.
- The Police never telephone and ask your bank card and pin number to be collected by a courier, transfer money, buy gold or withdraw cash to assist in an investigation
- X Always check the dialing tone after your call to ensure scammers are not still on the phone, use another telephone if possible or call a trusted friend first.
- If a courier arrives at your property ring 999


