The Committee has recently been reflecting accessibility of the Hall. During the summer months, it is great to see so many families using the Parish Council playground, teenagers using the skate park and basketball court and adults, having the odd game of pétanque or picnicking. We are often asked if people can use our facilities, as lack of toilets for old and young alike can become problematic if out for too long. If a member of the committee is here, that is not normally a problem, but obviously we are not here all the time. It is too much to expect hall users to have to unlock the door, all the time, as they have booked and paid for the use of the Hall. The Hall is generally locked while in use, for the sake of security. Unless we find a volunteer to be a 'door warden', I fear this situation is unlikely to become any easier. The same can be said of the car park.

We have signs in the car park that state it is for hall users, as it is part of the Hall and priority parking is given to those using the Hall. At the same time the Hall and Car Park are owned by the community, so if you need to park at the hall to fetch your children from school, or while you use the play area, or take the dog for a walk, then feel free, However, lately, we have had one or two issues with people leaving their cars in there long term, often because there is no road tax or insurance and they think, this will protect them. So let us make it clear. Anyone found 'dumping' a vehicle in the private hall car park for any length of time, without having notified the hall committee first, is likely to have it removed.

Extra car parking will be provided for the Garage Safari, on the Parish Council Land, next to the hall and we will have traffic marshals posted to facilitate this. looking forward to seeing everyone on the day and there will be lots of refreshments, for visitors, at the Village Hall. We have ordered in a lot more bacon for those butties!

Also similar to last year, we are having an open morning on Sunday, 29th September for people to bring in items for local food banks. These are always gratefully received, so it would be wonderful if you could contribute something. The Hall will be open in the morning for 09:30hrs to 12:30hrs for you to make any donations.







From the vicarage

In the Church's calendar, 29th September is the Feast of St Michael and All Angels. It's also the anniversary of the day when I became a 'Reverend'. I can still remember standing outside the West Door of Canterbury Cathedral, waiting in procession for the organ to signal the beginning of the service with the first notes of the hymn *Ye Holy Angels Bright*. One of my favourites, I'd like it at my funeral, which hopefully won't be for a while yet - although you never know.

Hymns have a certain something about them. Even today, BBC's *Songs of Praise*, first broadcast in 1961, still appears somewhere in the schedules most Sundays. Some folk were so upset when we were forbidden to sing hymns during the pandemic, that they stopped coming to church completely – and in some cases, sadly, they've never been back.

But the good news is that a couple of Songs of Praise services in church recently, brought in people who we either hadn't seen before, or at least not in a while. Just as on TV, people introduced what they had chosen to sing, and explained why. Sydney Carter's *Lord of the Dance* reminded some of their school days - and even, in one case, of evenings spent in the pub playing with a folk band. Other hymns brought back fond memories of those no longer with us, and others we sang simply because people liked them.

At the end there was still time for one more hymn. I happened to mention the offer that I'd made to the bellringers. And even though it wasn't Christmas, there was one hymn that just about everyone wanted to sing. And so it was that we finished with an enthusiastic rendition of *Ding! Dong! Merrily On High...* ... Brian



Neil Butcher, Trading Standards Officer, gave an interesting, informative talk about how to avoid being scammed by telephone, text, letter or on our own doorstep. Neil illustrated his talk with reference to incidences that had taken place in Kent. He stressed the point that anyone can fall victim to a scammer, but he also explained how to avoid or minimise our chances of being a victim. The main message was NEVER giving your bank details to anyone over the phone, via text or email, who has contacted you uninvited. (There are a few leaflets in the entrance to the Village Hall.)

Following our refreshments and the business side of the meeting, we had a game involving names of places in the UK which was great fun. It was incredible how your mind goes blank when under pressure to come up with the name of a place beginning with the letter "U" when all the obvious ones have already been said!!

- ➤ Land South of Cauldham Lane request for consultation of non-material conditions, to be challenged with DDC.
- ➤ Spitfire Flight schedule enquiry. No further action.
- ➤ Street light not working correctly in Avondale Road, reported.
- > Cut back of vegetation Playing Field boundary.
- ➤ Unleashed dog in Old Dover Road reported.

- ➤ Tactile Paving in places still waiting repairs.

<u>Public Rights of Way</u>: Clifftop path reports of tissue waste deposited, to be reported to DDC Environment Crime.

Speed Watch: Report received from delegate Councillor noted.

- ➤ 17 Sessions held since last meeting.
- ➤ GoPro cameras and batteries enquiry of the Team, if a larger capacity charger, on site, could lengthen usage times.
- > "Lorry Watch" majority decision, not a suitable scheme.
- > Team continues to carrying out sessions when possible.








Volunteers wanted


