Electric Scooters - know the law.

Electric Scooters - know the law

Although e-scooters can be great fun, it's against the law to ride one on a public road, cycle lane or

pavement. Please share this information with friends and family.

E-scooters are classed as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), which means they are treated as motor.

vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements, such as driving licence, insurance, number plates,

lighting, road tax, crash helmets etc. Without these, e-scooters cannot be used legally on the road.

The Government is currently trialling the use of approved rental escooters as environmentally friendly.

modes of transport in some specific locations in the UK.

For the rest of the country, under current law, e-scooters can only be used on private land with the

landowner's permission.

It's our priority to keep you and other road users safe.

We are obliged to act against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a

way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances we have the power to seize the e-scooter

under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act/165 of the Road Traffic Act – and we'd really prefer not to.



A suspect is to appear in court charged with making a false bomb threat in Dover. Kent Police was called to Stargate Street in the town at 11.08am on Thursday 15 August 2024, to a report that a suspicious package had been placed there. A cordon was put in place while the street was searched as a precaution. The call was deemed to be a hoax and an arrest was made

the same day.

A charge of making a false bomb threat was authorised against Dean Sarjeant, 52, of London Road, Dover. He has been remanded and is due to appear before Folkestone Magistrates' Court on Friday 16 August. Image



offenders either commit or conceal a crime – such as street lighting, abandoned buildings or poorly


designed spaces, vandalism, as well as behaviours of individuals or groups of people.

Please remain vigilant in and around the Village I am sure this is already happening but please look out for your vulnerable neighbours.

Last week Kent Police received a call from someone in Whitefield reporting the following.

An Irish male knocked on her door and despite her saying no at first, he has persuaded her to have her drive power washed. Unfortunately, she did not ask how much the work would cost, so when the work was complete the Male told her that she needed her to give him a £1000. The informant said that she did not have this money, so he asked for £600 instead, he told her to go to the ATM to withdraw the money, but thankfully her card would not give her that amount of cash. The male has then told her that she would need to go to the bank to withdraw the money and he would be back that afternoon to collect the money.

Police did attend and thankfully the males did not return and hopefully they wont now. Kent Police are now investigating this to establish who the males are, the male was working with someone else, they were both Irish and have the gift of the gab so may come across very friendly.
