Speed Watch are out in Alkham regularly, once drivers are caught 4 times or more, the local beat officers are requested to hand deliver a letter to the drivers warning them about their speed. As the darker evenings and colder weather draws closer, I remind residents to consider installing external security lighting to their properties, and ensure all windows and doors are locked before going to bed. Adding CCTV to cover the outside of your property and vehicle can be a good deterrent and help with any police investigations.


Examples of door-to-door scams Most door-to-door scams involve selling goods or services that are either not delivered or are very poor quality. You won't get value for money, and you may get billed for work you didn't want or agree to.

Some scammers conduct surveys just to get your personal details or as a cover to sell you goods or services you don't want or need, such as roofing work or patio replacement.

Unscrupulous employees sometimes still act illegally even when selling a genuine product by a genuine business. If someone knocks at your front door claiming to be from a company, first check their ID.

If you're not happy, don't let them in. Never call the phone number on their ID card to check them out. Ask the salesperson to wait outside, shut the door and find the company number on the internet.

Although e-scooters can be great fun, it's against the law to ride one on a public road, cycle lane or

pavement. Please share this information with friends and family.

E-scooters are classed as Personal Light Electric Vehicles (PLEVs), which means they are treated as motor.

vehicles and subject to the same legal requirements, such as driving licence, insurance, number plates,

lighting, road tax, crash helmets etc. Without these, e-scooters cannot be used legally on the road.

The Government is currently trialling the use of approved rental escooters as environmentally friendly.

For the rest of the country, under current law, e-scooters can only be used on private land with the

landowner's permission.


It's our priority to keep you and other road users safe.

We are obliged to act against anyone who is caught repeatedly using an e-scooter illegally or in a

way that causes a nuisance to others. In these circumstances we have the power to seize the e-scooter

under Section 59 of the Police Reform Act/165 of the Road Traffic Act - and we'd really prefer not to.

Prevent theft from a vehicle.

We have recently received reports of theft from a motor vehicle Dover and Deal. Having your car broken into and losing your things to thieves can be very distressing. There are a few simple steps you can take to keep your vehicle, and what's in it, safe.

Ensuring your vehicle is secured and valuables removed will prevent and deter opportunistic thieves.

Don't hide valuables in the boot or glove compartment. These are the first places a thief will look.

Consider purchasing a Faraday bag to store your vehicle keys.
